A Word from Bro. Mark –

I Saw the Light

At the end of a dusty and remote dirt road just a few miles from Interstate 30 around Gurdon, Arkansas there is a walking path that leads to an old railroad track. Beginning after dark, you would walk west down that track a little over two miles of rocky terrain, crossing five to seven railroad trestles or bridges, you can find a place to camp out for a while and wait for the spectacle of light so many people have journeyed to witness for 90 years. The Gurdon light is a source of great interest and speculation. It appears, usually around midnight, as a colorful floating sphere above the railroad tracks. The television series Unsolved Mysteries broadcasted an episode about this phenomenon back in 1994. Many people travel to see this light every year and it can be observed currently. Local university researchers have postulated that the light is caused by intense compression on a quartz deposit caused by the New Madris fault line. "Seeing the light" was a tradition for my college students when I served as the Baptist Collegiate Director at Henderson State University. People would make great effort for the experience.

Today, several of my co-workers and I prayed for someone making a similar journey. A Louisiana State University student, Jesse, has heard about Jesus from one of his friends that is a leader at the Baptist Collegiate Ministry. He wants to understand what he has heard. He is asking more questions and researching what it means to know and follow Jesus. Jesse is searching for the "light" of the world.

In John 8:12 Jesus says "I am the light of the world. Anyone who follows me will never walk in Darkness."

This coming Sunday is Easter. We will observe Jesus' sacrifice for the sins of the world on the Cross good Friday. For some folks it's a day off work or school. For others it's a sober occasion of recollection. Then Sunday will come. Many people will dress up in their finest spring clothes and head to a church to celebrate the resurrection of Christ and worship together. Join me in praying for many people who may not fully understand the difference between religion and knowing Jesus will travel to church to celebrate and will see "the Light" in Jesus. All this talk of light reminds me of an old hymn that is not often included in contemporary worship.

> Well might the sun in darkness hide And shut his glories in, When Christ, the mighty Maker died. For man the creature's sin. At the cross, at the cross Where I first saw the light, And the burden of my heart rolled away, It was there by faith I received my sight, And now I am happy all the day!

I want to encourage you to bring others with you this Easter Sunday as you take a journey to the Light! Pastor Mark Robinson

Superimposed love

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a total solar eclipse: God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."



At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that in Greek, *eclipse* means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.

Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of *appeared* here is *superimposed*, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."
