## In Remembrance I Corinthians 11: 23-26

We remember. When something really good – or bad happens, we remember. Many things can trigger memories – a word, a song, an odor, or any number of things. The more intense the event, the more vivid the memory. Often emotions get involved like happiness and joy or sadness, fear, quiet or shame.

Jesus encouraged us to remember what he had done for us and even gave us a beautiful, yet simple ceremony using unleavened bread and juice.

Paul told us to remember seven things. We remember:

- I. What Christ Has Done for Us
  - 1. He suffered for us
  - 2. He died for us
- II. What Christ Has Done in Us
  - 1. He Saved Us
  - 2. He Sanctified Us
- III. What Christ Does Through Us
  - 1. We Proclaim His Death
  - 2. We Preach His Return

As we hold our communion bread and cup, remember not only what Christ has done for us, but also the responsibility to serve Him until He returns.
