Sermon Notes:

Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savoir!

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Galatians 5:16-18 (ESV)

Paul is conveying to the reader that as Christians, ones who have been 'born again' with a new in-Christ spiritual nature that is pleasing to God, we are in constant conflict with the desires and wants of the old Adamic fleshly nature and our new eternal Christ-like spiritual nature. The works of the flesh are apparent as Paul describes further in his letter, but as we mature in our "walk by the Spirit" it becomes clearer that every facet and decision of our lives should be in line with the Spirit of Christ. Not our motivations based on man's wants and desires, but rather, what, where, and how is the Spirit leading us in our everyday life? A once noted descriptive interpretation of being 'Spirit lead' reads: "The Spirit is not a leader like the pace car in the "Daytona 500." He is a leader like a locomotive on a train. We do not follow in our strength. We are led by His power. So "walk by the Spirit" means stay hooked up to the divine source of power and go wherever He leads."

God could have chosen to remove the old sinful Adamic nature the moment we trusted Christ as Savior, but likely He chose to allow the two natures to co-exist within our earthly body so as to remind us of our human frailty and ensure that we maintain a surrendered dependence upon Him in <u>all</u> things.

Please continue to pray that we remain totally dependent on the Holy Spirit's wisdom, discernment, and leadership as we search for the shepherd God has for this body of believers.
