

Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

<u>1</u>Again David gathered together all the chosen men of Israel, thirty thousand. <u>2</u>And David arose and went with all those who were with him to Baale-judah [Kiriath-jearim], to bring up from there [to Jerusalem] the ark of God which is called by the Name--the very Name of the LORD of hosts, who dwells enthroned above the cherubim. <u>6</u>When they came to Nacon's threshing floor, Uzzah reached out [with his hand] to the ark of God and took hold of it, because the oxen [stumbled and] nearly overturned it. <u>7</u>And the anger of the LORD burned against Uzzah, and God struck him there for his irreverence; and he died there by the ark of God. 2 Samuel 6:1-2,6-7 (AMP)

When David became king over Israel one of the first things he did was to capture and establish Jerusalem as his capital and military stronghold. Once David made Jerusalem the political capital of a united Israel he wanted to make it the religious capital as well. This required bringing the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem from Kiriath-jearim, where it had been ever since it came back from the land of the Philistines in the days of Samuel, believed to be about 100 years. David led 30,000 chosen men to bring the Ark up to Jerusalem on a new cart they had built. However, David used a Philistine method rather than God's method for transporting the Ark of the Covenant, which led to serious trouble. God had previously ordained that only the houses of the Levites, after sanctifying themselves, were to transport the Ark of the LORD GOD of Israel, and then with poles through mounted rings on each side of the Ark.

The sudden death of Uzzah seems harsh and unfair! After all he was just trying to keep the Ark from falling off the cart. In reality though there is judgment for our actions that are outside the boundaries that God has ordained – both then and now. David later admitted his mistake of not seeking God's way that He has previously ordained. "Because you did not [carry it as God directed] the first time, the LORD our God made an [angry] outburst against us, for we did not seek Him in accordance with the ordinance." 1 Chronicles 15:13

David tried to do the Lord's work in the world's way when he used the Philistine method to transport the Ark. David's motives to bring the Ark to Jerusalem were right, but his means for doing it were wrong.

We, too, can have good motives, but go about them in ways that don't align with what God clearly tells us in His Word. How often do we find that when we stay inside the boundaries that God has ordained we can succeed in His will for us? Please continue to pray that our committee remains focused on HIS way in accomplishing our assignment.

"But first and most importantly seek (aim at, strive after) His kingdom and His righteousness [His way of doing and being right--the attitude and character of God], and all these things will be given to you also." Matthew 6:33 (AMP)
