Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands far away; For truth has stumbled in the street, and uprightness cannot enter. Truth is lacking, and one who turns aside from evil makes himself a prey. Now the LORD saw, and it was displeasing in His sight that there was no justice. Isaiah 59:14-15 (NASB)

The book of Isaiah was written approximately 700 BC in a time of rebellion by the people of God. But God's Word is true no matter when or where it is. It transcends time and reveals just how desperate we need a Savior. These verses are as if Isaiah penned them yesterday. Then and now, it's getting harder and harder to stand in agreement with God's Word without being attacked. Our adversary and deceiver of the world has an agenda to convince all people that wrong is right and bitter is sweet. The only righteousness we can attain is through Jesus Christ. The death and resurrection of Christ provided the way for truth and justice to be established in the world. But where people choose their own ways and do not follow the Lord, truth stumbles and there is no rightness. "Justice is turned back, and righteousness stands far away".

Evil seeks to position itself as far away from justice as it can get. Darkness hates the light and evil doers would prefer that justice turn its eyes away from their works so that they would not reap what they sow. When justice is displaced (turned back), evil progresses and truth is attacked with any deviation from that worldview. Those who deviate from that worldview become labeled as haters, bigots, hypocrites, and many others. "And one who turns aside from evil makes himself a prey". We should always remind ourselves that God is just, and as the last part of the verse describes, His displeasure is that there is no justice. Pray for change.

Father, work in the hearts of those whose evil predisposes them to shun Your light. Help their hearts to break over their sin. Show them the price that needed to be paid in order to redeem us to You. And guide each of us towards truth, justice, and righteousness. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
