

### Notes from the Pastor Search Committee:

Church Family,

Grace and peace to all in the name of Jesus our Savior!

And your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way, walk in it," when you turn to the right or when you turn to the left. Isaiah 30:21 (ESV)

We have all prayed for God's direction in our lives, His will and not ours, in a major decision that may affect others we love. Sometimes there are moments when we are hesitant to act, or answer His call, for fear of what may go wrong, unintentionally hurting others, or more importantly just not wanting to be mistaken about the Lord's will for our lives.
